Raise the Roof at Remsen's Stone Meeting House!

The roof of the Stone Meeting House needs to be replaced says architectural firm Bell and Spina which recently conducted a structural analysis.

The current slate roof was installed in 1888. "A slate roof should last about 100 years —so we have definitely

gotten our money's worth out of this one!" says Susan Bartholomew, member of the Remsen-Steuben Historical Society. "The cost of a new slate roof is staggering, but we are optimistic, and hope that through donations and grants, we will be able to replace it.
